No ATTORNEYS



Attorneys for parties to the dispute <u>are not permitted</u> to attend the pre-hearing mediation session(s), as the presence of attorneys at the pre-hearing mediation session would have the potential for creating an adversarial atmosphere not conducive to mediation of the dispute. This does not, however, preclude either party from communicating with its attorney to seek advice regarding the terms of a settlement proposal.

Principles of Personal Ethics




- Concern for the well-being of others, doing good (beneficence)
- Respect for the autonomy of others (autonomy)
- Trustworthiness & honesty (fidelity)
- Willing compliance with the law, with the exception of civil disobedience (justice)
- Basic justice; being fair (fairness)
- Reventing harm (non-maleficence)

- R NEUTRALITY
- Regional Program Development
 - Crossover with other areas
 - Responsive to needs of community

Arkansas impartiality of the mediator



- May not be an employee of the SEA or the LEA that is involved in the education or care of the child; and
- Must not have a personal or professional interest that conflicts with the person's objectivity.
- A person who otherwise qualifies as a mediator is not an employee of an LEA or State agency described in 34 CFR 300.228 solely because he or she is paid by the agency to serve as a mediator.

True Third Party Neutrality

Arkansas impartiality of the mediator



(3)(i) The State must maintain a list of individuals who are **qualified mediators** and

knowledgeable in laws and regulations relating to the provision of special education and related services.

- Special Education specific training
- **Program Fidelity**

Arkansas impartiality of the mediator



Is voluntary on the part of the parties

Is not used to deny or delay a parent's right to a hearing on the parent's due process complaint, or to deny any other rights afforded under Part B of the Act; and

Is conducted by a qualified and impartial mediator who is trained in effective mediation techniques A third party neutrality



Arkansas Special Ed Mediation Project requirements



- Be **CERTIFIED** by the AADRC in at least one area of practice
 - must maintain certification
- Adhere to the ethical practice of mediation, and
- Complete the 16 hour Special Education Mediation Training Course conducted by UALR William H. Bowen School of Law, and
- Observe **2** Special Education Mediation cases, both on a pro bono basis.

Arkansas Special Ed Mediation Project requirements

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Receive a minimum of two hours of continuing education in special education issues, as part of or in addition to the hours required by the ADR Commission for continuing education on an annual basis, and

Attend any additional training when deemed necessary by the Special Education Unit of the Arkansas Department of Education.

Practical Experience

for mediation certification



- Have observed, mediated, or co-mediated **TWO** mediations involving issues that would be heard in circuit court, other than domestic relations or juvenile matters;
- Observations and co-mediations must be of a case that is, or would be, filed in the civil division of the Arkansas Circuit Courts.

Observations and co-mediations must be completed with a mediator who is certified by the Arkansas ADR Commission.

Training Requirements

for mediation certification



- Minimum of 40 hours in a mediation training approved by the Commission
- Applicants who complete a mediation training course outside of Arkansas must also complete the Commissions course Mediator Ethics, Law and General Practices in Arkansas.
- Applicants must complete the certification process within five years of completing basic mediation training

Education requirements

for mediation certification



- Real Have a masters level degree or higher; or
- Have a bachelors degree plus a graduate level certificate in conflict resolution; or
- Realization Have a juris doctorate or equivalent; or
- Have substantial, demonstrated, and satisfactory knowledge, skills, abilities, and experience as a mediator in the applicable field of mediation

Ethics

for mediation certification



™ Be of good moral character; and

Accept and follow the Arkansas Alternative Dispute Resolution
